General Facts about the College

- Is the college public or private?
- What is the size of the college?
- Describe the fall class.

How many are freshmen? How many are transfers? What is the female to male ratio? How many live on campus? Where are their homes originally?

- Where is the college located?
- When was the college founded?
- Can a typical student graduate within four years?

The Academic Challenge

- Does the college offer my major program?
- What does faculty expect of students?
- Is the college on a quarter or semester system?
- Does the college offer a program of remedial studies?
- Is there an internship and/or cooperative education program?
- When must a major be declared and what support services are available to help students choose a major?
- Does the college accept AP, IB, or CLEP credit?
- Describe the department of my major area of interest.

How many faculty are there in the department? Are there figures on job placement and starting salaries?

Describe any unique equipment or features.

- Describe a typical class schedule for a freshman.
- What is the placement record into graduate and professional schools?
- Do graduate students teach courses?
- What are the student/faculty ratio and the average class size?
- Which agencies accredit the college?

- What percentage of faculty holds terminal degrees?
- In what ways does faculty challenge students to leave their "comfort zone" in order to excel?
- What percent of freshmen are retained to the sophomore year?
- What percent of the entering freshmen graduate within four years? Within five years?
- How much time do students spend on homework each week?
- Is there an honors program?
- Does the college offer a study abroad program?
- What percentage of students study in other countries?
- What types of assignments are given (papers, exams, problem sets, rehearsals, research projects)
- How much writing is expected?
- How much reading is assigned per class?
- What are exams like?
- In what ways are students given the opportunity to express themselves creatively in assignments?

Services Offered

- Are there tutorial services? In what areas?
- What services are available to help students adjust or cope with non-academic responsibilities (work, family, etc.)?

Active Learning

- How do students receive help selecting classes?
- How often are things learned in class discussed outside of the classroom?
- In what ways do students work together on solving problems in and out of class?
- How often do students make class presentations?

Campus Environment

- What do students like about this campus?
- How well do students get along with faculty, administrators, and staff?
- What do students do on the weekends and what percentage of students commutes?
- What do students do for fun?
- What types of public transportation are available on campus or in the area?
- What opportunities are available for spiritual expression and growth?

Out-Of-Class Experience

- What activities are available to help students apply classroom learning to real life?
- What types of student organizations are on campus and how active are they?
- What percentages of students do community service?
- What kinds of leadership opportunities are available?
- What kinds of special projects, seminars, or other experiences are offered or required of first-year students or seniors?

Diversity

- In what ways are students exposed to multiple cultures or diverse perspectives?
- How is diversity incorporated into the curriculum?

Technology

- How is technology used in the classroom?
- What types of computers, technology, online information and courses, and support services are available?

Campus Life

- Is campus housing available? For how many years?
- Are you required to live on campus your freshmen year?
- Where do students eat? Describe the food services.
- Are there flexible meal plans?
- Describe the health services that are available.
- May students bring a car to campus? Describe the parking situation.

- Describe the career placement program for graduates.
- Describe the residence hall facilities including regulations and special services.
- What are the statistics related to crime on campus?
- Is there a campus security force?
- What intercollegiate sports teams are available?
- Describe the local community.
- Does the college offer ROTC?
- Is there an orientation program for new students?

Other Things To Think About

- What kinds of activities are students involved in outside the classroom?
- What types of athletic and intramural activities are available?
- What kinds of entertainers, speakers, and cultural groups come to campus?
- Where are recent graduates employed?

Costs

- What is the total cost <u>per year</u> for a boarding student including all required fees? What is the cost for a commuter? Does this include books?
- Is there non-resident tuition?
- What sources of financial aid are available?
- What percent of students receive aid?
- Describe the process of applying for aid. What forms are required?
- What scholarships are available?
- Is employment available for students?

Admission

- Describe the application process. Is it rolling admissions? When are students notified?
- What is the application fee? Can it be waived?
- What is the application deadline?
- What is the confirmation deadline? Is a deposit required? Are there extensions?
- What credentials are required for admission as a freshman? As a transfer student?
- Which standardized tests are required or accepted?
 How does the college use these?
- Are placement tests required?
- Is an interview required or recommended?
- Does the college use class rank? Is a weighted rank accepted? How is an unranked student evaluated
