As a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, Shippensburg University can offer students a quality education at a surprisingly affordable cost. Ship offers a variety of financial aid options including scholarships, grants, loans, and student employment. The Ceddia Union Building (CUB) is the hub of student life; it's a building for the students and by the students. Living the Suite Life

Ship opened three new suite-style residence halls in 2013 and will open three more in summer 2014. The four-story halls feature suites with bathrooms shared by no more than two students and individual controls for air conditioning and heat. The nine-foot ceiling adds space that is sure to make students feel right at home. There are six different unit options to choose from. EAT UP! When it comes to food, students expect options—at Ship, that's exactly what they get. There are *four* meal periods a day (breakfast, lunch, dinner, and late night) and *nine* dining destinations on campus including two all-you-care-to-eat dining halls. Other options are Outtakes, Sub Generation, Papa John's Pizza, Starbucks, Grill Nation (all natural burgers and fries), 2.mato (pizza, calzones, pastas, and other Italian favorites), Homestyle Kitchen, Sushi Do, Mondo Subs, Freshens Smoothie Co., and a convenience store with Dunkin' Donuts Coffee, snacks, and more!
