






Percentage of Art & Design Positions by Region




Top Art & Design Positions

Learn more about an agency's mission, structure and current hiring on their website.

3. Create an account on USAJOBS.gov

Did You Know?

- There are almost 300 art and design positions available in foreign countries.
- Many art and design jobs require technical knowledge, such as familiarity with computeraided design software like the Adobe Creative Suite or After Effects.
- The average salary for a job in art and design is \$83,000 per year.
