

The federal government offers a variety of opportunities for individuals with knowledge and skills in nursing, physical therapy, pharmacy, veterinary science, dentistry and more. For example, physical therapists help wounded warriors regain their capabilities at the Department of Veterans Affairs, public health advisors coordinate responses to potential epidemics at the Centers for Disease Control and prevention and health scientists research the impact of pollution at the Environmental Protection Agency.

Medical and Public Health Positions by Region




Top Medical and Public Health Fields

SEARCH FOR MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH POSITIONS

With so many opportunities to use your medical and public health skills, it may be helpful to sort positions by **job category**. The most common categories are listed below. You can search **USAJOBS.gov** using these keywords or by using the job series code, a four-digit number corresponding to a government job category.

Explore a variety of positions and agencies, then focus your search to a few that align best with your interests and skills.

Did You Know?

- Nearly 70 percent of federal employees in the medical and public health field work for the Department of Veterans Affairs.
- In fiscal 2010, the federal government hired over 12,000 nurses and nursing assistants.
- The federal government employs more than 2,300 veterinarians and animal health technicians, 89 percent of whom work for the Department of Agriculture.

Examples of Job Positions

Pharmacist (0660)

Department: Department of the Army Agency: Army Medical Command Salary Range: \$86,300-\$104,400/year Location: San Antonio, Texas

As a Pharmacist, you will:

- Provide authoritative instructions, advice and assistance to prescribing and dispensing officials on the effectiveness of available drugs
- Monitor the dispensing of all pharmaceuticals and analyze patterns and trends to determine appropriate, effective, and economical prescribing and dispensing of drugs
- Develop, with the attending physician, pharmacotherapeutic regimens for especially difficult or complex cases in the Emergency Department

Medical Instrument Technician (0649)

Department: Department of Veterans Affairs Agency: Veterans Health Administration Salary Range: \$38,700-\$61,600/year Location: Lebanon, Pennslyvania

As a Medical Instrument Technician, you will:

- Perform patient instruction and education
- Perform tests and monitor multiple physiological data
- Troubleshoot polysomnographic recording equipment
