With a president who is a mask and vaccine skeptic, it is perhaps not surprising that Brazil currently has the world's second largest number of deaths from COVID-19 after the US. Nevertheless, the Brazilian states have carried out successful vaccination




campaigns thanks to a public health system that is recognized internationally as having one of the most efficient mass vaccination models in the world.
