The following year he became Operations Officer, 1st Squadron, 12th Cavalry Regiment, and subsequently served as the squadron's Executive Officer, and as Executive Officer, 2nd Battalion, 33rd Armor. In 1993 he reported to the Pentagon for duty as Command Briefer/Senior Analyst, Yugoslav Task Force, in the JCS J2. While in that assignment he was deployed from November 1993 to April 1994 as Chief, Defense Intelligence Agency, National Intelligence Support Team (NIST), Joint Task Force Provide Promise, Naples, Italy. From 1995 to 1998 Colonel Sadler served as the Defense and Army Attaché to the Republic of Croatia, Zagreb, Croatia. In 1998 he assumed duties on the International Military Staff, Headquarters, North Atlantic Treaty Organization, Brussels, Belgium.
