Born and raised in Walnut Bottom, Pennsylvania; a small village situated seven miles north of Shippensburg. He graduated from Big Spring High School, in Newville, Pennsylvania, in 1964.

After serving two years in the U. S. Army as an enlisted soldier, Colonel Stouffer attended the Harrisburg Area Community College, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, receiving an Associate of Arts Degree in Social Science. From 1994 to 1997 Colonel Stouffer was the Chief of the Military Police/Military Intelligence/Language Branch, Enlisted Personnel Management Directorate, Total Army Personnel Command, located in Alexandria, Virginia. In 1998, subsequent to attending the Foreign Service Institute for Spanish language training and Attaché Course at Bolling Air Force Base, he was assigned as the U. S. Army Attaché, in Lima, Peru.

COL Stouffer's awards and decorations include the Defense Superior Service Medal, Bronze Star, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Army Meritorious Service Medal with four oak leaf clusters, Army Commendation Medal, Joint Service Achievement Medal with oak leaf cluster, Army Achievement Medal, Joint Meritorious Unit Award with oak leaf cluster, and the Army Good Conduct Medal.
