COL Kashi Yatto is the Special Assistant to the Commanding General for the U.S. Army Soldier Support Institute at Fort Jackson, South Carolina. She serves as a liaison and subject matter expert to the SSI and Ft. Jackson Commanding Generals, school commandants and staffs, and is the Senior National Guard Advisor on post, representing the National Guard. Fort Jackson is the largest basic combat training post in the United States.

After attending the War College, she again returned to Washington and was the Manager for Employer Services for Employer Support for the Guard and Reserve (ESGR), an agency within the Office of the Secretary of Defense.
