## MAJ William H. Lloyd

## Pennsylvania Army National Guard

MAJ Bill Lloyd is a native of Levittown, Pennsylvania, and a 1982 graduate of the Pennsylvania State University, receiving his Bachelor of Science in Health, Physical Education and Adaptive Physical Education. In 1982, Bill joined the Pennsylvania Army National Guard and attended Basic Training at Ft. Knox, KY and his Advanced Individual Training (AIT) at Ft. Sill, OK. He was assigned to C Troop, 1-104<sup>th</sup> Cavalry as a 31V. From there, MAJ Lloyd was a member of the Long Range Surveillance Detachment 1-104<sup>th</sup> Cavalry and attended Airborne School at Ft. Benning, GA. In 1988, he achieved his Master's Degree in Education from Wilkes University.

Commissioned into the Armor Branch after graduating from Officer Candidate School in 1989, Bill attended Armor school at Ft. Knox, Kentucky, and was assigned to 1-103<sup>rd</sup> Armor as a Scout Platoon Leader. After three years, MAJ Lloyd transferred to 1-108<sup>th</sup> Field Artillery in Carlisle, PA. While with the 1-108<sup>th</sup> FA, he was the HHBN Communications Platoon Leader/Executive Officer, Service Battery Commander, Det. 1 B Battery Commander and the BN S4. In 1994 he attended the Advanced Officer Field Artillery course at Ft. Sill, OK.

In 1997, MAJ Lloyd took on an AGR assignment at The Pennsylvania State University, followed by an assignment to Shippensburg University as an Assistant Professor of Military Science. His first ROTC assignments would last until 2001 after which he returned to the Shippensburg Area School District, where he began his career in 1983, as a Physical Education Teacher and coach for variety of sports to include soccer and wrestling. During that time, he was the Commandant of The Pennsylvania State Officer Candidate School and commissioned over 150 Second Lieutenants during his tenure. MAJ Lloyd then returned to active duty in 2003 as the Assistant Professor of Military Science at The Pennsylvania State University until 2005. Following his second tour of duty in ROTC, MAJ Lloyd was then assigned as the State Mobilization Officer at DCSOPS located at Ft. Indiantown Gap.

In February 2009, Bill deployed with the 28<sup>th</sup> Combat Aviation Brigade to Iraq in support of OIF 11 and spent time at COB Adder, Talil, Iraq. Upon return from Iraq, he was assigned as the S3 of Joint Emergency Operations Center and was responsible for the joint emergency preparedness for the state of Pennsylvania in coordination with PEMA. In 2012, MAJ Lloyd transferred to HHBn, 28ID as the Executive/Administrative Officer for the battalion. His final assignment in the Pennsylvania Army National Guard began in 2013 when he returned to Shippensburg University ROTC as the Assistant Professor of Military Science. During his tenure at Shippensburg University his assignments included being the Regimental Training Officer at the Leadership Development and Assessment Course at Ft. Knox, KY during the summer of 2014. Bill was also the Mission Executive Officer for Cultural Understanding and Language Proficiency Program in Thailand in the summer of 2015. He also served as the Director of the Student Veterans of America at Shippensburg University as well as an Assistant Wrestling Coach at Penn State Mont Alto Branch Campus. He currently is the Senior Army Instructor and Athletic Director at Carson Long Military Academy in New Bloomfield, PA; and a Deputy with the Pennsylvania Game Commission.

Upon retirement, MAJ Bill Lloyd will have influenced the commissioning of over 150 Officer Candidates and over 325 ROTC Cadets to earn the rank of Second Lieutenant. His awards include the Meritorious Service Medal (3 oak leaf clusters), Army Commendation Medal (five oak leaf clusters), Army Achievement Medal (four oak leaf clusters), Army Reserve Component Achievement Medal (five oak leaf clusters), National Defense Service Medal (bronze star), Iraq Campaign Medal, Global War on Terror Service Ribbon , Armed Forces Reserve Medal (gold hour glass and M device), Non-Commissioned Officer Professional Development Ribbon ( numeral 1 device), Army Service Ribbon, Army Overseas Service Ribbon, Pennsylvania Army National Guard Commendation Medal, Pennsylvania National Guard Service Medal (two oak leaf clusters), Pennsylvania Twenty Year Service Ribbon (silver star), Pennsylvania National Guard MAJ General Thomas R. White Military Ribbon, Pennsylvania National Guard Recruiting and Retention Military Ribbon (numeral 3 device), Pennsylvania National Guard General Thomas J. Stewart Military Ribbon, Parachutist Badge, Joint Forces Staff Identification Badge.
