Overview of Shippensburg University's General Education Program

The General Education Program at Shippensburg University comprises 45 of the credit hours required for graduation. It consists of 5 themes with 2-3 required course goals in each theme

-Foundations: 15 credits (3 credit first-year seminar not currently required for transfer students)

- Writing^W, Oral Communication^O, History^H, Quantitative^Q

-Interconnections: 9 credits required from 3 goals with at least 3 credits required in Diversity and 3 credits in Global Perspectives

- Diversity^D, Global Perspectives^G, Foreign Language^F

-Citizenship & Responsibility: 6 credits required with no more than 1 course from the same goal category

- Citizenship^S, Ethical Reasoning^E, Critical Reasoning^R

-Natural World & Technology: 9 credits required with at least 6 credits completed in the Natural World category

- Natural World^N, Technology^T

-Creativity & Expression: 6 credits required with at least 3 credits required in the Literature category

- Literature^L, Arts^A, Creative^C

COURSES TO BE COMPLETED AT SHIPPENSBURG UNIVERSITY (59 credits)
Major Requirements - Required Core Courses (9 credits)
CRJU 309 Theories of Crime and Crime Control – 3 credits
CRJU 310 Research Methods – 3 credits
CRJU 452 Race, Ethnicity, and Crime – 3 credits
Major Requirements – Criminal Justice Electives (21 credits) Students will select at least 7 CRJU courses at the 300 or 400 level
Major Requirement – Capstone (3 credits): CRJU 454 Policy, Professionalism, and Ethics – 3 credits
Major Requirement – Interdisciplinary Courses (9 credits): Students must take at least 3 courses/9 credits at the 200 level or higher in any discipline except Criminal Justice or Military Science.
Electives (0-18 credits)
Students should consult with their Ship Academic Advisor to discuss the possibility of completing additional credit toward a minor.

NOTES (IMPORTANT, PLEASE READ)

1. 0-Level courses do not count toward graduation requirements and will not transfer.
2. Courses for Shippensburg University have been selected by joint agreement of HCC and SU. However, curricula are subject to change. Please speak with your advisor and/or the SU transfer counselor if you have any questions. A transfer counselor from SU visits HCC on a regular basis throughout the academic year. Call the SU Office of Admissions about the specific days and times.
3. Completion of an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will result in the waiver of remaining general education requirements at SU; as a result, any course can be chosen for this category. Required major gen eds and major coursework will be listed as needed/permitted in this guide. Please consult with the SU transfer advisor with any questions.
4. Criminal Justice courses must have a grade of “C” or better to transfer to Shippensburg and a 2.3 cumulative GPA is required to be granted admission into the program.
5. **The information in this guide may be subject to change. Students are advised to note the date on the guide and periodically check in with the HCC Advising Center for an updated guide, as well as use this guide with the assistance of a HCC Counselor/Advisor. Following this guide does not guarantee transfer of credit or admission to Shippensburg University.**
