




ONE-YEAR MASTER'S IN APPLIED HISTORY

Shippensburg University's Master's in Applied History trains students as professional historians who engage the public. **Our new 4+1 program** allows graduating seniors to begin coursework during their last year as undergraduates, finishing their master's in two additional semesters with a summer internship.

4+1 PROGRAM

Students develop a strong foundation in history and learn to pass on their knowledge as public historians trained at some of the finest public history institutions in the nation, within a three-hour drive of campus.

- Take graduate coursework during your senior year.
- Take 18 credits of graduate coursework the following year.
- Intern during the summer following your graduate year.

Applied History 4+ 1 Graduate Program

One- Year Master's in Applied History: Shippensburg University's Master's in Applied History trains students as professional historians who engage the public. The 4+1 program allows graduating seniors to begin coursework during their last year as undergraduates, finishing their master's in two additional semesters with a summer internship.

Students develop a strong foundation in history and learn to pass on their knowledge as public historians trained at some of the finest public history institutions in the nation, within a three-hour drive of campus. The typical structure for the program includes taking graduate coursework during your senior year, taking a full course load of 18 credit of graduate coursework the following year, and completing your internship during the summer following your graduate year.

Applying to the 4+1 Program:

- Candidates for the 4+1 program need to apply for it during the second semester of their junior year (or in the first semester of their senior year).
- Students must have a 3.0 GPA to apply for the program and maintain a 3.0 GPA through graduation.

Senior Year:

- During their senior year, in consultation with their advisor, students will take two 400, 500, or 600 level classes (6 credits) in addition to their undergraduate courses that they have left. These courses will count both toward their undergraduate degree and their MA degree.
- Providing that they have 120 undergraduate credits and have fulfilled all requirements, students will graduate with a BA at the end of their senior year.

Graduation:

- Students attending the MA program full time will be able to graduate in one calendar year including two summer classes/internships.
- Students in the 4+1 program are highly advised to pursue the internship option.
