Application procedure	
Step 1 – Nomination	Exchange students must be officially nominated by their home university. Nominations will be made via a separate nomination sheet.
Nomination deadlines	Fall semester or academic year: 1 April Spring semester: 1 October
Step 2 – Online application & Required documents	All incoming exchange students apply online via our application portal and submit digital documentation. No hard-copies are required. Nominated students will receive application instructions via e-mail. Information about the application can also be found here. The following documents are required for all students: 1. Official Transcript of Records (in English) 2. Motivation Letter 3. Copy of Passport Please note that students applying for HDK-Valand Academy of Arts and Design will receive separate application instructions upon nomination and will need to submit portfolio work.
Application deadlines Please note separate nomination deadlines and application procedures for the Faculty of Fine, Applied and Performing Arts below.	Fall semester/Full academic year: 15 May Online application portal open 1 March–15 May Spring semester: 15 November Online application portal open 1 September–15 November Please note: due to current waiting lines for visa/residence permit in Sweden, all students in need of a visa are advised to apply before 1 May or as early as possible. Applications are processed regularly while the online application portal is open.

Full time studies, grading and course load	A normal workload (full time studies) for one semester is 30 credits, for full academic year: 60 credits. Courses usually consist of 7.5 credits, 15 credits, or 30 credits each. Courses are taken in a modular system which means students generally take one course at a time with a final exam at the end of each course.
