Altars were created by students from HIS 360: History of Mexico course under the direction of **Dr. Gretchen Pierce, Associate Professor of History**. Día de los Muertos is a holiday celebrated in Mexico, parts of the United States, and a few other Latin American countries from November 1–2. It honors deceased loved ones with their favorite food, drinks, and personal items. These objects, plus religious symbols and brightly colored skulls are placed on altars in the home or at gravesites. The tradition merges together pre-Hispanic customs, the Catholic All Saints' and All Souls' Days, and the more secular holiday of Halloween.
