JOIN DR. JOSEPH T. ZUME ON A PHOTO ESSAY JOURNEY

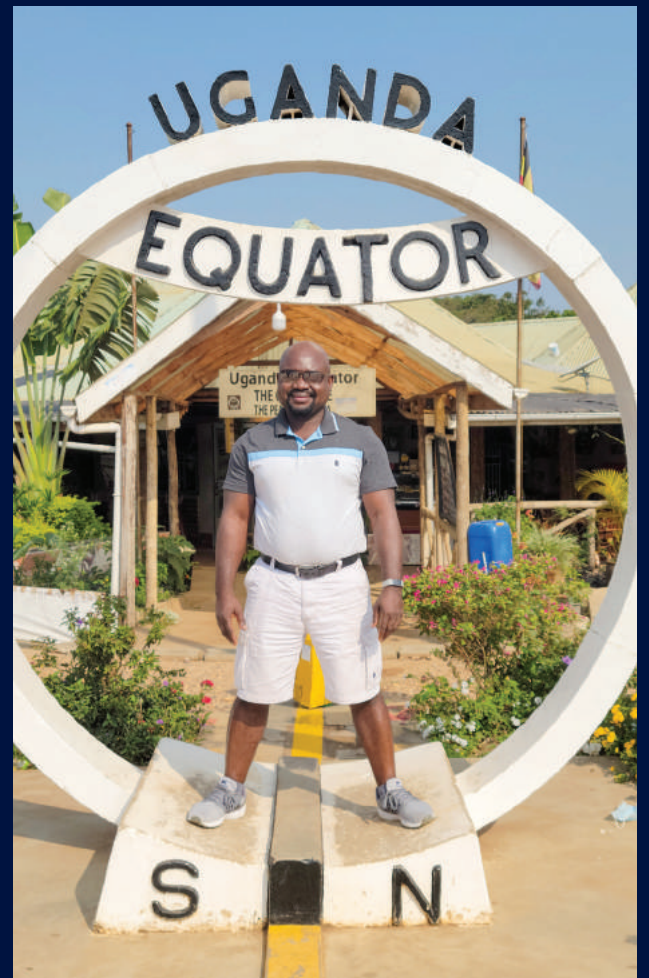


Dr. Joseph Zume travelled to Uganda in summer 2021 on a fellowship from the Council for the Development of Social Science Research in Africa (CODESRIA). COVID-19 restrictions complicated his travel, but he still managed to visit many celebrated tourist destinations that help explain why Uganda is called “the Pearl

of Africa.” In addition to showing photos of his travels in paradise, Dr. Zume will discuss his CODESRIA fellowship at Makerere University in the Department of Geography, Geo-informatics and Climatic Sciences. The pandemic forced the cancellation of planned groundwater research, but he still ran virtual seminars, and a writing boot camp for faculty and graduate students, and assisted in hosting an in-person field school on landscape ecology. These activities contributed to the goal of CODESRIA to cushion the effect of brain drain on African universities.

Dr. Joseph Zume is a professor of Geography and Earth Science at Shippensburg University.
