There are a variety of aid types available and can be reviewed on the website. These aid types include: University and private scholarships and PASSHE scholarships. Additionally, there are several loan types available including federal loans and private loans.

The average loan debt according to the Department of Education for a Shippensburg University student is \$25,250.00. A veteran student may have more or less debt depending on their VA benefits.

■ Graduation Rates

- As of Fall 2019, Shippensburg University's four year graduation rate for first time in college was 40%, and the six year graduation rate was 55%.

■ Transfer of Credits

- All college-level credits awarded by postsecondary institutions with United States Department of Education (USDE) accreditation will be accepted in transfer, regardless of how the prior learning was acquired. The intent of this policy is to maximize the acceptance and application of college-level credits awarded by postsecondary institutions with USDE-recognized accreditation.
- Shippensburg University will first apply as many college-level credits as possible toward the satisfaction of general education requirements, then to requirements in the major and finally to elective credits. A course by course match will not be required for general education courses. Vocational, technical and career courses may fulfill major curricular requirements or credits required for graduation in specific programs. Developmental and remedial coursework will not transfer.
